Maths

Some of the outstanding features of the dynamic Mathematics Faculty for 2019 include:

- Two exciting new members Mr Scott Hogden and Mr Ashton Tselepy, who are already providing valuable innovation into the delivery of Mathematics to our students.
- We continue to utilise a variety of on-line learning platforms that permit us to extend our teaching/learning beyond the confines of the classroom these include Education Perfect, Educreations and the Eddie Woo video series.
- Our school provides the facility for highly talented Mathematics students to be accelerated beyond their current year group. We currently have four students who are completing their senior courses while in Year 10.
- Mr Bill Feruglio has recently conducted testing of our Year 7 students for numeracy and literacy under the Best Start program. He is currently conducting analysis of the results of this testing, in order for us to tailor our delivery more effective

Technical and Applied Science (TAS)

Term 1 has seen the TAS classrooms come alive with excitement, creativity, innovative thinking and learning. The TAS faculty have challenged themselves in all areas of technology endeavouring all students to achieve their personal best.

Ballina Coast High School has welcomed back Glenn Worthington who has inspired Year 10 students in engineering and designing and fabricating drones that are almost ready to fly. Year 11 and 12

We have welcomed Scott Etienne as an exchange teacher from Canada inspiring students and taking a leading role with new technologies specifically in laser engraving machines creating new and exciting design projects in Design and Technology.



Science

Term 1 has gone by incredibly quick and the Science Faculty has enjoyed a number of highlights with students.

Marine Technology - Year 9 students have been rearing red claw in our aquaculture facility; Year 10 students are obtaining their boat licences through a school partnership with RMS; some Year 12 students will be obtaining their SCUBA certification. Students also harvested, filleted and cooked our first run of farm raised Jade Perch!

Agriculture - Students are rearing Jade Perch in our aquaculture facility and are looking forward to the construction of a fruit orchard, community garden and chicken coop next term.

Years 7-9 Science - Rockets; cardboard marble runs; science video blogs; sodium explosions and ecology excursions have all made this term exciting to say the least. One experiment unintentionally triggered the school smoke alarms and evacuation of the entire building! Creative Arts

It is full steam ahead in the Creative Arts Department and we are thrilled with the new facilities in our purpose built classrooms. Students of all years are currently engaged in assessment work and are working well on a variety of practical and theoretical learning opportunities.

We are excited to have three students nominated as semi-finalists in the Moran Contemporary Photography Prize. Our student's works have been selected from schools across Australia and we are very proud of their efforts.

Drama students had a wonderful trip to Sydney to attend Onstage, which are the best HSC performances of 2018 along with other theatrical experiences. They returned with focus and determination to begin planning their own HSC pieces.

The dancers are currently preparing for the Dance Festival and will have an incursion later this term to consolidate their routines for this event. They are also involved in choreographing dances for the MADD Production.



Languages

It is a very exciting time to be studying Japanese right now, as 15 students and three teachers are preparing to depart for a two-week visit to our Sister School in Togane, Japan during the April school holidays. This will be reciprocated in March 2020 with our Sister school visiting us.

Students are currently enjoying lunchtime viewing of Anime shows, and are looking forward to the opportunity to try some Karaoke next term.

Careers

The start of the school year has been a very busy time in Careers. We have hosted the University Showcase. Among the showcase were representatives from the University Of New England, Southern Cross University, Bond University, University of Queensland, Griffith University and TAFE. The University of Melbourne also visited to discuss Indigenous pathways to University.

We have quite a few students this year who have been successful in gaining School based traineeships in a range of areas such Early Childhood, Health, Hairdressing, Construction Automotive, Engineering and Business Services.

Some Year 10 students have undertaken work experience throughout this term. If any businesses would like to host one of our students, please contact the school.

The Professionals in Residence Program has kicked off with several community members spending the day talking with our students. Residences so far include a retired Airline Pilot and a former Griffith University Student ambassador coming in over the next two weeks.

The Defence Force Recruitment team has been here twice this term for presentations about life in the Army, Navy and Air Force and they are planning to return to Ballina to host a Recruitment session next term.



HSIE stands for Human Society in its Environment.

Our junior subjects include world history and geography. In Year 10 we offer modules including VET Business Services, Commerce, Causing Conflict and People and Events that Shaped the World.

Our senior curriculum is wide and varied. Subjects offered include Modern and Ancient History, Legal Studies, Business Studies, Society and Culture, Geography and Aboriginal Studies. We also offer VET courses such as Retail and Business Services.

We are a fun filled faculty who love to get out of the classroom and in to the field.

TETistory is revisited with Year 8 through ancient ruins that told stories – archaeology told the narrative.

Scientific and geographical investigations led Year 9 to develop inquiry and scientific research skills. They developed a hypothesis and looked at our local oyster farming.


